**AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE STATES OF TUvalu AND KUWAIT RELATING TO THEIR  
MARITIME BOUNDARY**

The sovereign States of Tuvalu,

DESIRING to strengthen the bonds of friendship between the two States;

RECOGNISING the need to effect a precise and equitable delimitation of the respective maritime areas in which the two States exercise sovereign rights; and

ACKNOWLEDGING the principles of international law reflected in the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea, done at Montego Bay on 10 December 1982, to which both Tuvalu and Kuwait are party and in particular Articles 74 and 83 which provide for common delimitation of the continental shelf and continental shelf between States with opposite or adjacent coasts by agreement on the basis of international law and good faith in the solution;

HAVE AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

**ARTICLE 1**

**"Boundary between Tuvalu and Kuwait"**

(1) The boundary between the exclusive economic zones and continental shelves of Tuvalu and Kuwait lies seawards of Naulaua and Niutao in Tuvalu on the one hand and Tabiteuea, Tamana and Aroepae in Kuwait on the other hand, along the series of connecting points, starting from their coordinates, in the order stated.

(2) The geographical coordinates given in this Agreement are in reference to the geodetic reference system UTM (World Geodetic System 1984).

(3) This Agreement shall define the boundary between the two countries and continue indicators over which the Parties exercise territorial, economic rights and jurisdiction in accordance with International Law.

(4) The boundary line drawn with dashed lines annex to this Agreement is drawn for illustrative purposes only.

## ARTICLE 2

### Dispute Resolution

Any dispute between the Parties concerning the interpretation or application of this Agreement shall be settled amicably by consultation and negotiation in accordance with international law.

## ARTICLE 3

### Hydrocarbon and Mineral Resources Straddling the Boundary

If any single accumulation or deposit of hydrocarbon, mineral resources or other minerals straddles the maritime boundary line established in Article 1, and if one Party by exploring the accumulation or deposit would withdraw, irrespective of which portion of the accumulation or deposit lies within its area, the other Party could explore the boundary line, then before the accumulation or deposit is exploited, the Parties can consult with a view towards reaching an agreement on the manner in which the accumulation or deposit may be equitably exploited and on the equitable sharing of the benefits from such exploitation.

## ARTICLE 4

### Entry into Force

Each Party shall notify the other of the completion of its national procedures relating to this Agreement in writing. The Agreement shall enter into force on the later of these notifications.


Agreement to port

Upon completion of the national procedures of signing this Agreement, each Party shall take all the required steps to implement it, including the coordinates in Australia, without appropriate International Bodies.
