The Permanent Mission of Iceland to the United Nations, pursuant to the request of the Secretary-General of the United Nations, dated 11 January 2020, invites the Government of Iceland to submit information on the actions taken pursuant to paragraphs 113, 117 and 119 to 122 of resolution 7489 (LVII) and paragraphs 124, 126, 127, 130 and 132 to 134 of resolution 7501 (LVIII) and paragraphs 175, 177 to 180 of resolution 7502 (LVIII) relating to the management of fisheries stocks.

The Government of Iceland is pleased to submit the following information:

Icelandic vessels are permitted to fish in international waters in order to fulfil their general obligations of conserving living marine resources and to ensure the sustainability of the fishing industry. Iceland's Exclusive Economic Zone and regulations on the management of fisheries stocks have been adopted by the Regional Fisheries Management Organisations of which Iceland is a member and to which Icelandic vessels are subject.

Icelandic vessels are also permitted to fish in international waters in order to fulfil their general obligations of conserving living marine resources and to ensure the sustainability of the fishing industry. Iceland's Exclusive Economic Zone and regulations on the management of fisheries stocks have been adopted by the Regional Fisheries Management Organisations of which Iceland is a member and to which Icelandic vessels are subject.

Icelandic representatives have taken active part in the implementation of the NEAFC Permanent Committee on Management and Science and the NEAFC Joint Fisheries Commission Scientific Group on Ecosystems, Fisheries and Ecosystems. Icelandic experts take part in annual meetings in both organisations and through their work support the adoption of management measures that are based on the precautionary principle and the ecosystem approach to fisheries management. No reference is made to detailed submissions to NEAFC for implementation for further information on such measures adopted.
