The submission is made in accordance with Article 76(1)(b) of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea. As Nicaragua observes in the Executive Summary of its Submission, the submission is made without prejudice to the question of the delimitation of the maritime boundary between the two countries.

In light of the above it is evident that Nicaragua's compliance with its international obligations as a state party to the United Nations Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women is as follows:
