A national conference on the right to know in to Cambodia

An UNDEF project in Cambodia held a nat onal conference on cit zen's access to informat on in May 2013 with part cipat on of government, human rights experts, legal pract t oners and civil society leaders. It was part of an UNDEF-funded init at ve in Cambodia to improve social accountability and transparency, strengthen administrat ve and management procedures and to improve local authorit es' response to the needs of local communit es. The project provides training and capacity building for local councils on access to informat on, awareness raising act vit es through public community forums, cit zen feedback mechanisms, media campaigns and advocacy for a nat onal legal framework on access to informat on. The init at ve is implemented by the Advocacy and Policy Inst tute, a leading advocacy inst tut on in Cambodia in the feld of access to informat on at local and national levels.

Building access to information in the Chittagong Hill Tracts

> An UNDEF project in Bangladesh empowers indigenous people in the Chit agong Hill Tracts to access informat on on public services of ered by local government inst tut ons and departments. In this way, the init at ve contributes both to indigenous communites' part cipat on in the democrat c governance process, and to their access to public services for their survival, livelihood and development. The project increases awareness of the legislated right to informat on, generat ng public demand, strengthening community-based inst tut ons as an informat on source, sensit zing local government and NGOs about their roles and responsibilites for informat on delivery, and strengthening and organizing local media to cover and advocate right to informat on issues. The project is implemented by Trinamul Unnayan Sangstha.

UNDEF funds a project to empower Jordanian art sts and journalists to act as "Freedom Messengers" -- catalysts and networkers for free speech and media. The project, focused on people under 35 and implemented by the Center for Defending Freedom of Journalists in Jordan, held a public event at Amman's Royal Cultural Center in June featuring street theatre, rap music, short f Ims and more, performed by art sts in the Freedom Messengers Network.
