

Preliminary information submitted by the Republic of Venezuela to the
Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf

1. The Republic of Venezuela is a State Party to the 1983 United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea ("UNCLOS") and the Convention on the Limits of the Continental Shelf.
2. The Republic of Venezuela is mindful of its obligations under the Convention and of the importance of the work of the Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf (the "Commission") for Coastal States and the International Community.
3. Pursuant to the Decision concerning the island of the Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf and the ability of States, including small island developing States, to fulfil the requirements of article 13 of annex II to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea, as well as the decision contained in SPC/2007/2, paragraph (a), (CPR/CN/1027) the following preliminary information is provided to provide an indication of the outer limits of the continental shelf beyond 200 nautical miles from the coast of the continental shelf extended from the islands of Venezuela (Imaumpony and Hunter) (hereinafter referred to as "Venezuela's continental margin").
4. The Republic of Venezuela has informed the Commission of the Imaumpony (Imaumpony) and Hunter (Hunter) of the Republic of Venezuela and the continental margin which extends from them are land territory and maritime extensions within the framework of the UNCLOS and the Convention on the Limits of the Continental Shelf, and the outer limits of the continental margin have been established by law to date.
5. The Preliminary information also notes that the maritime boundary delimitation remains outstanding between the Republic of Venezuela and the Republic of Guyana. Pursuant to article 23, paragraph 2, Annex II to the Convention, the preliminary information is provided for the purpose of the three trilateral Conference on the delimitation of the maritime boundary between Venezuela and Guyana.
6. The Republic of Venezuela acknowledges the decision of the Government of the French Republic that, Annex V, dated 22 May 2007, requested the Commission to consider the outer continental margin in the period beginning after 22 May 2007.
7. The Republic of Venezuela has commenced work on the preparation of the submission in respect of the areas listed below. The following documents are assembled in chronological order:

8. In addition to the measures that it has already taken, Vanuatu has committed to this Note that it is considering arrangements for assistance from United Nations agencies and other bodies in the preparation of the submissions to the Commission on the basis of the Continental Shelf Treaty, the Convention on the Law of the Sea and the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea for the purposes of specialized software and technical training for this purpose.
9. The Republic of Vanuatu is pleased to request a further submission, prior to the Southern continental shelf before 2015, in order to assist the Commission in the performance of its functions under the Convention in an efficient and timely manner. In this regard, the Republic of Vanuatu will strive to take advantage of all available data and opportunities for the scientific and technical capacity building of its institutions in order to complete the preparation of its submission.
10. The Republic of Vanuatu wishes to associate itself with the statement contained in paragraph 1(h) of SLOS/133, pending the receipt of the preliminary information submitted by the continental shelf registrant, that the information contained in the submission is preliminary; information submitted by the Registrant is not necessarily final and may be considered by the Commission.
11. The Republic of Vanuatu also notes that in accordance with the statement contained in paragraph 1(i)(c) of SLOS/133, any preliminary information submitted is without prejudice to the finality of the submission and may be subject to revision by the Commission.
12. The Republic of Vanuatu requests that the Secretary-General of the United Nations to inform the Commission and, prior to making any decision on the receipt of this preliminary information, to advise the Director of Legal Affairs of the United Nations, in accordance with the statement contained in paragraph 1(d) of SLOS/133.
