### Introduction

1. We, the Heads of State and Government and High Representatives meeting at the United Nations Summit on the Sustainable Development Goals, 25 to 27 September 2015, as the Organization celebrates its seventieth anniversary (as decided today on the global Sustainable Development Goals).
2. On behalf of the peoples of the world (as adopted as a historic decision on a comprehensive, people-centred set of priorities and transformative

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## Sustainable Development Goals and targets

57. Concluding an inclusive, process-oriented intergovernmental negotiations/ and based on the proposal of the Open Working Group on Sustainable Development Goals<sup>15</sup> which includes a comprehensive set of 17 Goals and targets which have been agreed.

58. The Sustainable Development Goals and targets are integrated and indivisible/ global in nature and universal/ taking into account different national realities/ capacities and levels of development and respecting national policies and priorities. Targets are defined as aspirational and global/ with each Government setting its own national targets guided by the global level of ambition but taking into account national circumstances. Each Government will also decide on these aspirational and global targets should be incorporated into national planning



Goal 1. End poverty in all its forms everywhere

- 1.1 By 2030, eradicate extreme poverty (currently less than \$1.25 a day)
- 1.2 By 2030, reduce at least by half the number of people living in poverty in all its dimensions according to national definitions
- 1.3 Implement nationally appropriate social protection systems and measures for all

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8.c. Significant increase access to information and communications technologies and strive to provide universal and affordable access to the Internet in least developed countries by 2020

**Goal 10. Reduce inequality within and among countries**

10.1 By 2030, progressively achieve and sustain income growth of at least 7% per cent of the population at a rate higher than the national average

17.8 Enhance international support for implementing effective and targeted capacity building in developing countries to support national plans to implement all

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are sustained efforts to address ongoing challenges should be strengthened through the exchange of experiences, improved coordination and better and more coordinated support of the United Nations development system / the international financial institutions / regional organizations and other stakeholders.

70. The Secretary-General will lead a high-level panel of experts to develop a blueprint for the Addis Ababa Action Agenda in order to support the Sustainable Development Goals. The blueprint will be based on a multi-stakeholder collaboration between member States/civil societies/private sector/scientific community/United Nations entities and other stakeholders and will be coordinated by a United Nations inter-agency task force on science, technology and innovation for the Sustainable Development Goals, a collaborative multi-stakeholder forum on science, technology and innovation for the Sustainable Development Goals and an online platform.

0. The United Nations inter-agency task force on science, technology and innovation for the Sustainable Development Goals will promote coordination/coherence and cooperation within the United Nations system on science, technology and innovation-related matters/ensuring synergies and efficiencies in particular to enhance capabilities/building initiatives. The task force will draw on existing resources and will work with the 10 representatives from civil societies/private sector and scientific community to prepare the meetings of the multi-stakeholder forum on science, technology and innovation for the Sustainable Development Goals, as well as in the development and operationalization of the online platform/including relevant protocols or modalities or other and the online platform. The 10 representatives will be appointed by the Secretary-General/or periods of two years. The task force will be open to the participation of all United Nations agencies/funds and programmes and functional commissions of the Economic and Social Council and it will initially be coordinated by the entities that currently integrate the informal working group on technology facilitation/enablement (lead) (lead), etc.



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80. We re-emphasize the Secretary-General's in consultation with the Member States to ensure the effective implementation of the 2015 Summit of the High Level Political Forum, which outlines critical milestones towards coherent, efficient and inclusive global development, and re-emphasize at the global level the need to ensure that the 2015 Summit includes a formal recognition of the organizational arrangements for State-led initiatives at the High Level Political Forum under the auspices of the Economic and Social Council, including recommendations on voluntary cooperation guidelines. It should clarify institutional responsibilities and provide guidance on annual themes/ on a sequence of thematic initiatives/ and on options for periodic initiatives at the High Level Political Forum.

81. We reaffirm our commitment to achieving the Agenda and utilizing it to the fullest to transform our world for the better by 2030.
