Population ageing is a well established global demographic trend, with major socio economic consequences. The long term shift of the share of the population in different age groups has important implications for the age structure.

Researchers have used measures and indicators that are based on biological age, which provides a simple, clear and easily comparable measure of ageing. At the same time, there has been a significant shift in the type and level of activity, productivity, and other socio economic factors. These have changed significantly over the last century, and even more so in recent years. The development of alternative concepts and measures is needed to better understand the levels and trends of ageing, and a more nuanced approach is required in different contexts. At the forefront is the Characteristics of Ageing developed at IIASA.

The way we understand and measure ageing, have important implications for national development policies and programs, and the development goals that are agreed. Development goals that are related to or are influenced by ageing affect the

significant implications for labour markets, life long education and health, and the interactions and mutual support of older persons with the younger generations.

Recognizing the diverse stages and characteristics of ageing in various regions of the world, as well as the recent developments and innovations in measurement, the Population Division the Department of Economic and Social Affairs (DESA), the International Institute for Applied System Analysis (IIASA),
