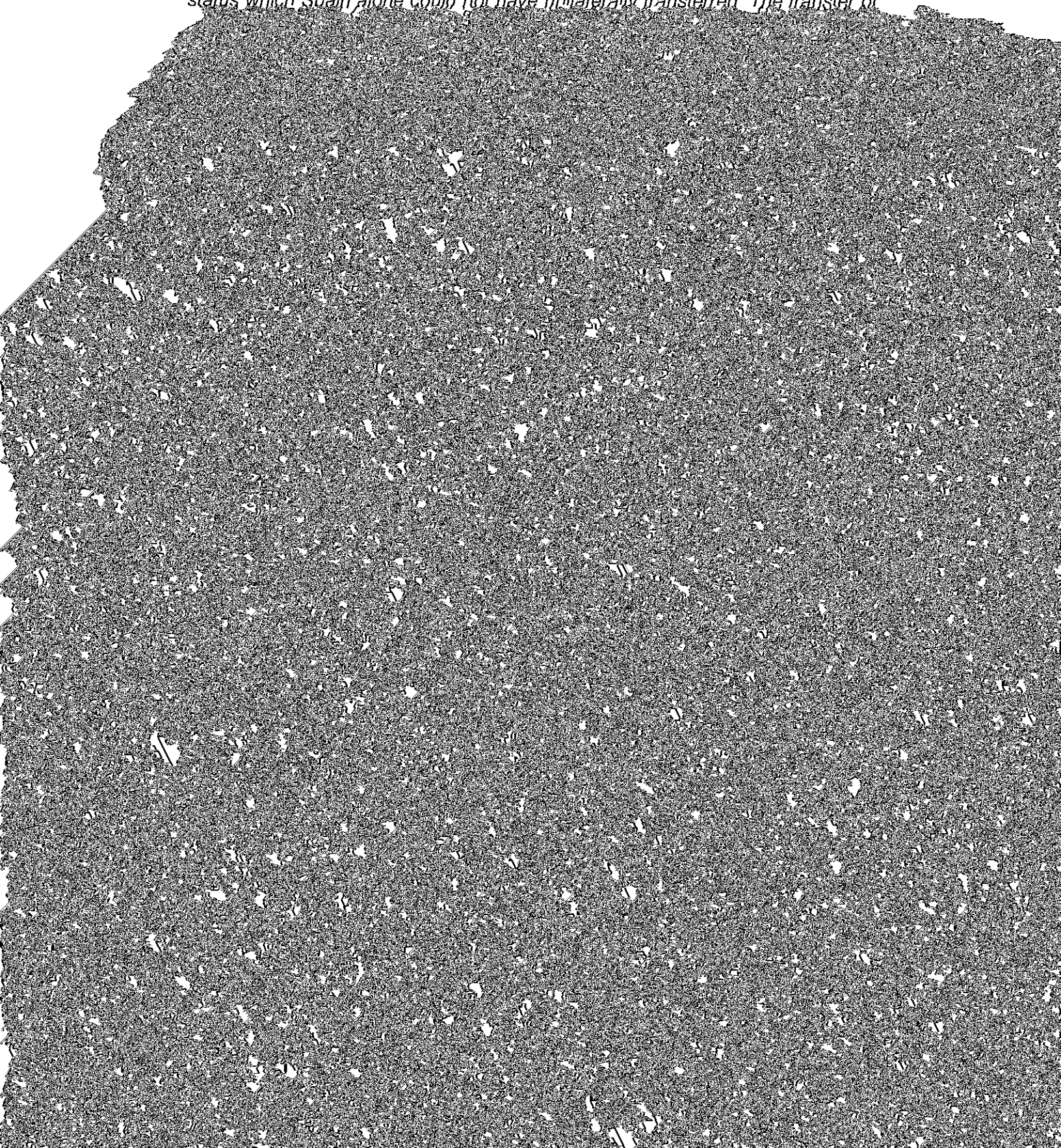

The reason for the delay in the decolonisation of Western Sahara, the last



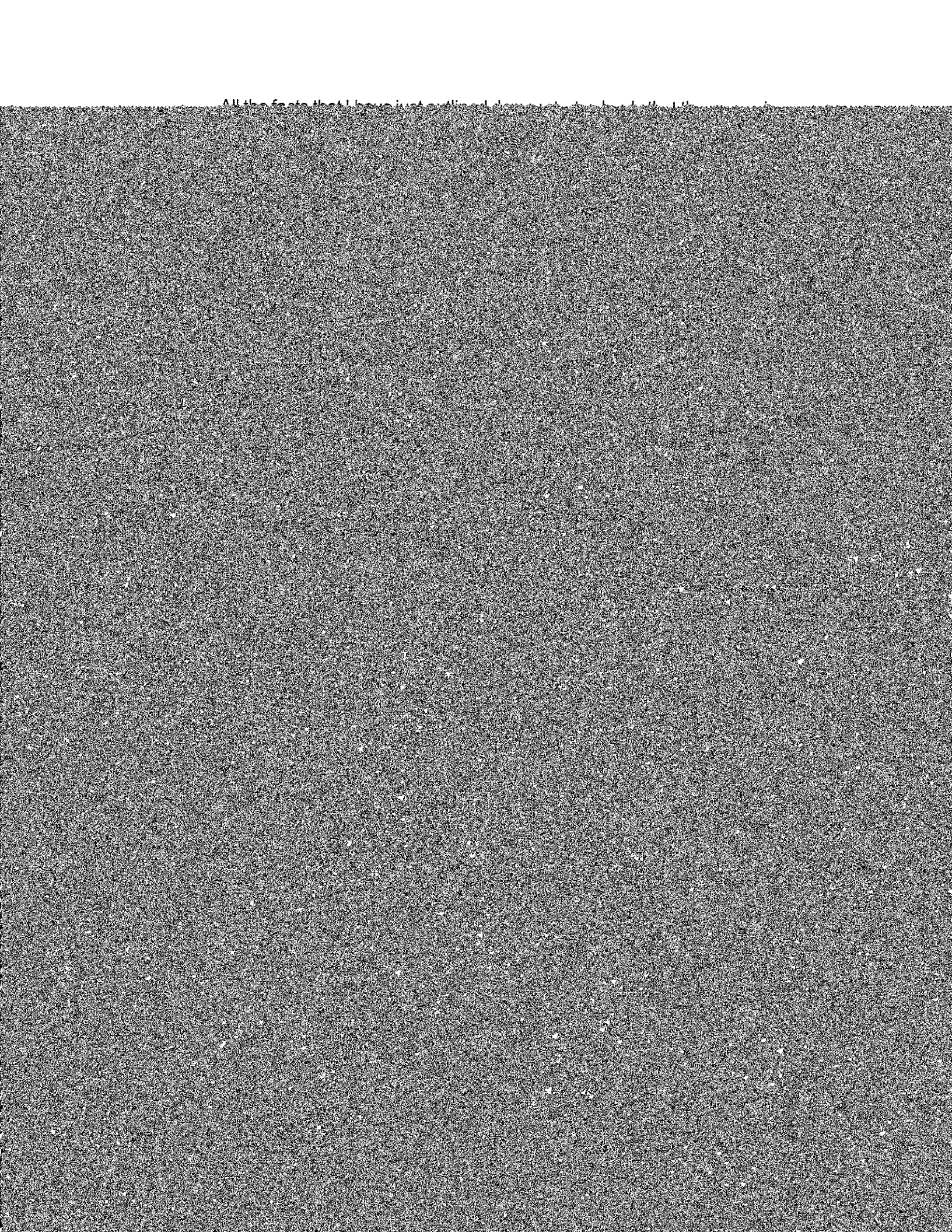

Resolution 40/50 of 2 December 1985. After the acceptance by the Frente POLISARIO and Morocco of the UN-OAU Settlement Plan in August 1988, on 29 April 1991, the Security Council established, under its authority, the United Nations Mission for the Referendum in Western Sahara (MINURSO) to

implement the plan and hold a referendum on the self-determination of the people of Western Sahara.
