Statement by H.E.Mr. Fernando Wainon Ferreira
Permanent Representative of the Republic of Cabo Verde
to the United Nations

on the occasion of the General Assembly
Special Session on ESD Principles

New York, 22nd September 2014

Mr President,

Excellencies,

Ladies and gentlemen,

At the outset, I would like to congratulate you, Mr President, on your election and express the satisfaction of the Government of the Republic of Cabo Verde to take the floor in this twenty-nine special session.

We have received with welcome the report of the Secretary-General contained in the document 'A New World: A Framework of Action for the follow-up to the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development Beyond 2014'.

The Government of Cabo Verde shares the conclusions of the report, in which the increase of individual human rights, capabilities and dignity, across the multiple dimensions of life, is the foundation of sustainable development.

Mr. President,

Cabo Verde has been "proudly meritocratically" at the centre of its endeavours to implement the Programme of Action, particularly in the field of poverty reduction, access to sexual and reproductive health services, access to education, reduction of maternal and child mortality, family planning and promotion of reproductive rights. Gender equality, women's empowerment and women's empowerment has been one of the highest priorities for the Government.

In its annual report just released, UNFPA indicates that Cabo Verde is about to achieve the MDG 4 on child and maternal mortality. I would also like to inform that Cabo Verde is on the track of accomplishment of the MDGs.

Mr. President,

The education of a young population and job creation continue to pose a great challenge to the Government of Cabo Verde. However, as a consequence of the sound policies in this field, the lower rate of fertility and the ageing of the population have created a new challenge, one related to the growing immigration, which has already started to pressure our social and economic structures. The expertise and support of the UNFPA in this matter will be of the utmost importance to Cabo Verde.

Cabo Verde still fully committed to the further implementation of the programme of Action of the ICPD. We are awaiting now with the outcome of our regional review and the findings and recommendations of the ICPD beyond 2014.

Let me conclude by stressing the need to build the momentum for the continuous and strong support of the UNFPA to implement the 15 recommendations contained in the report of its review for Cabo Verde.
