Mr. Chairman,

3. My delegation takes note of the proposed resource requirements for the period from 1
January to 31 December 2012 for 30 Special Political Missions authorized by the General
Assembly and/or the Security Council amounting to \$617.6 million. This includes proposals of
\$590.2 million for 27 missions which were in existence at the time the Secretary-General

4. The Advisory Committee, in its report, recognizes the reduction in the level of resources
requirements under operational costs when compared to the approved budgets for 2011.

5. My delegation would like to take this opportunity also to express our concerns with the late
