Mr. Chairman,

Eugenia Casar, Controller, Mr. CHOI Soon-hong, the Chief Information Technology Officer (CITO) and Mr. Collen Kelapile, Chair of the ACARQ, for introducing their reports.

Mr. Chairman,

Umoja/ERP is an essential element in the introduction of IPSAS to the UN Secretariat, which was agreed upon by the Member States in 2005, and that a significant amount of resources exceeding some 120 million dollars have

already been invested in this project. We believe that it would be inadvisable to give up halfway through its implementation because it has met some difficulties. Our delegation strongly encourages the Secretariat to focus its attention and energies on this project.

As communicated by the end of 2013, the financial resources available for this project will be exhausted by the end of 2015. Within the framework of existing resources of approximately 100 million dollars, as communicated by the Secretary-General in his report, in this respect, our delegation feels that the high vacancy among the Umoja/ERP team as well as its subject-matter experts, if left unaddressed, will continue

to impede the timely and cost-effective implementation of the project. For this reason, our delegation requests the Secretary-General and other senior

~~staff members of the Secretariat to pay sufficient attention to this issue and~~

Second, with regard to the ICT strategy; our delegation fully acknowledges the problems that stem from the fragmented state of ICT

~~1. Significant and significant benefits will be produced by addressing this issue through greater coherence and coordination of the management of ICT activities. On the other had, we also understand the situation that this Organization currently faces, now more than ever, the necessity of tighter budgetary discipline, as demonstrated by the Secretary-General's initiative in formulating a 2012-13 budget proposal and recognizing that would take into account that, as mentioned earlier, this Organization has to address a daunting~~
