Having said that, I would like to assure the Committee that my colleagues and I are closely monitoring the progress and developments and will ensure a swift completion of the project. Moreover, the project management team in the Commission continues to work proactively with all project constituents to make certain that the project can be completed as soon as possible; steps have already been taken in this regard: for example, office furniture systems have been installed ahead of schedule as spaces are completed to reduce the time it will take to occupy the building.
