Regarding the proposed requirements for consultants, the Advisory Committee believes that some functions could be performed using existing United Nations in-house expertise and therefore recommends a reduction of 5 per cent to the proposed resources in this respect. With respect to official travel outside of the mission area (non-training), the Committee also recommends a reduction of 5 per cent and reiterates that resources for official travel should be utilized judiciously in the interest of the Organization and that the primary consideration in authorizing official travel should be whether direct face-toface contact is necessary for mandate implementation.

I would like to highlight that the Advisory Committee was informed that the Mission's operations on the ground were interrupted as a result of the security situation, and that, during July 2014, UNSMIL relocated its international staff members to Tunisia and to Italy.
