

Distinguished Delegates,

1. I have the honour to introduce the Secretary-General's report A/73/662 on Managing afterservice health insurance (ASHI). The report reflects the analysis, conclusions and recommendations of the inter-agency Working Group on After-Service Health Insurance, established by the Secretary-General under the auspices of the Finance and Budget Network of the High-level Committee on Management of the United Nations System Chief



2. The Working Group comprised representatives of 18 United Nations system entities.

3. The report has been endorsed by the High-level Committee on Management, and areas where consensus had not been reached in the Working Group are also indicated in the report.
