

Statement of the Chairman
Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions

4 May 2020

With regard to the after-service health insurance liabilities, the Board found a weakness in the census data provided to the actuary of the United Nations Joint (Technical) Pension Fund. The Advisory Committee expresses concern about this situation and intends to request the Board to conduct a review of the after-service health insurance expenditure, so as to increase transparency and ensure compliance with the financial regulations and rules of the United Nations.

In its report, the Committee highlights the observations and recommendations of the Board on various other aspects of the peacekeeping operations including the financing of peacekeeping support activities.
