## 5. Transforming global governance

Action 1: We will reform the UN Security Council, recognizing the urgent need to make it more representative, inclusive, transparent, efficient, effective, democratic and accountable.

1. In response to the growing urgency to increase the effectiveness of the United Nations abilities to maintain international peace and security as set out in the UN Charter, we agree on the following

Development

- Goal 16.8, increase representation of developing countries and small- and medium-sized states.
- (c) Continue discussions on the issue of representation of cross-regional groups, taking into account that Small Island Developing States, Arab States, and others, such as the OIC, have been mentioned in the discussions of the IGN.
- (d) Intensify efforts to find an agreement on the question of the categories of membership taking into account the discussions held in the IGN process. The reform will include, but not be confined to, an expansion of 2-year term non-permanent seats as part of a comprehensive Security Council reform.
- (e) The total number of members of an enlarged Council should ensure a balance between its representativeness and effectiveness.
- (f) The working methods should ensure the inclusive, transparent, efficient, effective, democratic and accountable functioning of an enlarged Council.
- (g) The question of the veto is a key element of Security Council reform. We will intensify efforts to reach an agreement on the future of the veto
