The Permanent Representative of Belgium to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour to refer to his note LA/COD/4 of 17 January 2011 regarding resolution A/65/30, entitled "Consideration of effective measures to enhance the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions and representatives".

In that connection, he has the honour to transmit herewith a table listing reported incidents involving foreign diplomatic and consular offices in Belgium. This document also sets out the measures taken by Belgium as a host country to ensure the security and safety of such offices in its territory.

With regard to incidents involving Belgian diplomatic offices abroad, the Belgian authorities would refer to the recent carjacking of the Ambassador of Belgium in Ouagadougou (Burkina Faso). This incident is being followed closely by the Belgian security services.
