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CHIEF OF DELEGATION

The interdependence between the Rule of Law and gender equality should be emphasized. The Security Council Resolution 1325 on Women, Peace and Security underlines the role of women in achieving sustainable peace and security. The Council should take steps to ensure the safeguarding of the existence of the rule of law.

At the core of the rule of law is the principle of equality before the law. The international community, national governments, regional organizations, and civil society should be staunch supporters of the rule of law. Courts and tribunals, and attach great importance to the strengthening of the internal justice system. We likewise believe that the rule of law should be considered when Rule of Law strategies are considered in the way of the International Court of Justice. The rule of law is a key element in the rule of law and a key tool for peaceful resolution of conflicts.

At the program level, we think that the promising global rule of law initiative should cover as many aspects of the Rule of Law as possible, ensuring maximum impact. The UN, and D. R. need to, in tandem with agencies and other actors.

Another important element is the report of the Secretary-General's High-level Panel of Eminent. The rule of law on the next 2015 Development Agenda.

For the UN, along the way, it needs strategic and financial support. The Rule of Law Coordination and Resource Group are there for consultation and the range of public and private stakeholders' concerns.
