We commend the Special Rapporteur, Professor Shinya Murase, for his commitment and guidance to the Commission. His third report focused on several important issues, including the obligations of States concerning prevention of atmospheric pollution, mitigation of atmospheric degradation, due diligence and environmental impact assessment. We are quite skeptical about providing any list of *ius cogens* norms. On the other hand, the Commission, together with the Secretariat, could gather, as part of consideration of this topic, relevant information on the use of the concept of *ius cogens* in the recent practice of States and international courts.

In our opinion, *ius cogens* norms are exemptions to other rules of international law. They protect fundamental values of international community and are universally applicable. We are not convinced about the normative possibility of existence of regional *ius cogens*; as mentioned in the
