On & KDSWHU;, RQ 32WKHU GHFLVLRQV DQG FR to FOXVLRO Philippines considers the revised draft model clauses complementary to the Guide to Provisional Application of Treaties, clarifying issues and providing guidance to states that wish to resort to provisional application of treaty under Article 25 of the Vienna Convention on the Law of Treaties. We do not view the model clauses as promoting or encouraging resort to provisional application, but rather as a tool to assist states should they decide, and if conditions permit them, to resort to provisional application of a treaty. We will submit further comments on this in advance of the commencement of the second reading of the draft Guide to Provisional Application of Treaties at the seventy-second session of the Commission.
