<u>06.04.2018 - Turkey - Photographs of the Embassy taken by an individual</u>: The Crisis Centre was informed.

<u>Shortly before 30.05 - Poland - Acts of vandalism</u>: Damage caused to the external windows of the Permanent Mission of Poland to the European Union and of the Permanent Representative's residence

01.06.2018 - Korea - Theft in the basement of a diplomat'

<u>26.01.2019</u> - Cameroon - Illegal entry and acts of vandalism: A dozen people attempted to enter the Embassy compound following the re-election of Paul Biya the previous weekend, damaging the main entrance door. The frequency of police patrols was increased.

<u>22.11.2019 - Turkey - Act of vandalism</u>: Graffiti on the front facade of the Mission of Turkey to the European Union. The Crisis Centre was informed.

<u>28.11.2019 - Turkey - Act of vandalism</u>: Posters stuck on the Embassy facade with the inscription "Stop army R-Turkey#rise Up4Rojava". The Crisis Centre was informed.
