Under central order, *Zentrale Dienstvorschrift* (ZDV), 241/1 (*Humanitarian Protection in Armed Conflicts—Manual*), soldiers and civilian employees at all command levels have access to the pertinent rules of international humanitarian law as interpreted by the Federal Ministry of Defence. Field cards with specific questions and descriptions of the manual supplement this information. Units selected for operations are required to receive training in accordance with the manual.

Germany's ratification of the Rome Statute were incorporated into German domestic law in June 2002. Amendments to domestic criminal law concerning extra-territorial cooperation between Germany and the ICC are contained in a separate code in order to achieve transparent and coherent regulation of cooperation with the ICC (*Gesetz über die Zusammenarbeit mit dem Internationalen Strafgerichtshof*, concerning the cooperation with the International Criminal Court). The German government has provided financial support for efforts towards securing critical evidence in trials currently taking place.

Germany is a party to the Convention on the Prohibition of the Use, Stockpiling, Production and Transfer of Anti-Personnel Mines and on their Destruction (Ottawa Convention).
