## Strengthening and promoting the international treaty framework March 2020

In response to the request by the Office of Legal Affairs of the United Nations of 27 June 2019 to submit information and observations to be considered in the preparation of the Secretary 'v OE o [• OE ‰ } OE š GenOEral Assesmbly R@solution6/210, Austria would like to offer the following remarks

Austria welcomes the update andhodernisation of the Regulations to give effect to Article 102 of the UN Charter by GA Resolution 73/210 as of 1 February (Derparticularly appreciate the explicit recognition of threle of depositaries other than the Secreta General in Article 1 para. 3 of the Regulation sustria is also serving as the depositary of several multilateral treaties andis registering such treaties and any amendments thereto very diligently. Austriaalso complies with the duty of registering ibsilateral treaties. In this regard, it was very timely to adapt the Regulations to moderactices of electronic communication. We believe that the use of electronic means so as, for instance, standard registration through acustomised online tool, should be further discussed This could not only add to the efficiency in treaty registration, but also simplify the procedure and thereby encourage more universal treaty registration

Regarding capacity building not technical assistance Austria would like to highlight the importance of the work of the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affaired its constant adviceoffered to Member Stateson matters of treaty registration, depositary functions and other matters relating to treaty law and practice view of the continuing shortcomings in treaty registration, such cooperation and dialogue need to be intensifiated additional measures should be considered. This could entail, for example, regular events on topsiate issues in the margins of the intensition of the intensition of the intensition of treaties.

Austria notes the growing backlog in the publication of treaties in the UN Treaty Series. While we reiterate the importance of maintaining the multilingual nature the Treaty Series, we believe thatan open dialogue on the review the translation policy's needed, with a view to enhance efficience and to ensure the swift publication of treaties in accordance with Article 102 para. 1 of the UN Charter. Such review should take into account the limited resources available to Member States as well as Theaty Section providing accurate translations of treaties.
