My delegation also highly appreciates the outstanding contribution and sacrifice of peacekeeping personnel in the field.

Indonesia believes that serving in UN missions should not be an excuse for any wrongful behavior or criminal activities on the part of an official. It is critical that all UN officials and personnel perform their duties in a manner that preserves the credibility of the UN.

With this in mind, we wish to make the following points.

First, we strongly support the zero-tolerance policy of the UN, especially in matters of sexual exploitation and abuse.

Being the face of the UN in the communities where they are deployed, all UN personnel must meet the performance and professional standards of the UN.
