Thankyou MadamChairperson,

Sloveniaaligns itself with the statemen previously delivered by the European Union on this agendatem, and would like to convey the following remarks in its national capacity.

At the outsetwe would like to thank the SecretaryGeneral for his report on the scope and application of the principle of universal jurisdiction and all Member States and observers or their contributions.

Although there is currently no accepted definition of the principle of universal jurisdiction, it could be described as criminal jurisdiction based solely on the nature of the crime, as distinct from the traditional base of jurisdiction, which typically requires ometype of territorial, nationality or other connection between the State exercising the jurisdiction and the conductat issue.

The principle of universaljurisdiction is a unique ground of jurisdiction in international aw that permits States to exercise national criminal jurisdiction over certain crimes in the interest of the international community as a whole, such as war crimes, crimes against humanity, genocide, slavery and torture, among others.

By clarifying fundamentabonceptsandelementsof universaljurisdictionunderinternational law, there is less risk that Stateswould either infringe the sovereigntyof another State or decline to exercise their criminal jurisdiction due to misunderstanding its application.

Finally, the international community as a whole must step togetheras one to promote the cause of justice by acting against individuals who may not otherwise be held accountable, particularly in case of crimes that shock the conscience of all humanity.
