9. Similarly, we welcome the shared experiences by Member States as measures taken to provide support to victims and urge continued cooperation in the protection of victims and witnesses in a manner ensures that their dignity is upheld.

10. In dealing with cases of accountability, that Member States share equal responsibility, especially where acts are committed within territorial jurisdiction, or committed by a subject national to effectively bear such responsibility

United Nations system and related organizations to help to ensure the coherence and coordination of policies and procedures relating to the reporting, investigation, referral and follow-up of credible allegations revealing that a crime may have been committed by personnel of such agencies and organizations who fall outside the scope of General Assembly resolutions, with policies and procedures related to United Nations officials and experts on mission. We wish to assure him that this call aligns with our mission.

14. As I conclude Chair, Kenya remains committed to working closely with the Secretary-General to help deliver on our commitments in a prompt and appropriate manner as we aim for nil returns on criminal conduct by UN officials and experts on Missions.
