The Commission on International Humanitarian Law, as an advisory and consulting body to the President of the Council of Ministers, tasked with the dissemination of the norms of international humanitarian law for the purpose of their introduction into the Polish legal system, prepared and adopted in 2024 the Fifth Report on the implementation and dissemination of international humanitarian law in Poland for 2019-2023.

This Report is a continuation of the Fourth Report on the implementation and dissemination of international humanitarian law in Poland for 2015-2018. The current Report, which demonstrates efforts toward the implementation of international obligations assumed by Poland and promotion of international humanitarian law, have been accomplished with a significant participation of and support from diverse ministries, the Polish Red Cross, civilian and military academies.

Topics of international humanitarian law have been included in the core curricula of general education for primary and secondary schools, as well as disseminated through the curricula of the majority of civilian and military universities in the country. Additionally, in years 2019–2023, a number of academic conferences were held and several dozen publications released in the field.

Poland has also consistently supported the activities of the International Humanitarian Fact-Finding Commission, which was created in 1991.
