The Permanent Mission of Greece to the United Nations, in accordance with the letter of the Director of Legal Affairs of the United Nations, dated 12 October 2023, has the honor to submit the following update to the information submitted in 2023:

Article 8 of the International Code of Crimes for the Prosecution of War Crimes (ICPCW) reads:

"Greek penal laws apply by their own force to nationals and to foreigners who respect the laws of the following acts committed abroad:

- a) high treason against the Greek State;
- b) crimes concerning military service;
- c) punishable acts committed by persons in official functions or organs or civil servants;
- d) a. act against or directed to an official of the European Union or of a public international organization or the exercise of his or her functions;
b. bribery of a person performing public functions;
- e) false testimony in the context of a criminal trial;
- f) terrorist acts;
- g) piracy;
- h) crimes against the law of the sea;
- i) illegal trafficking in narcotic drugs;
- j) trafficking in human beings;
- k) any other crime to which Greek penal laws apply by virtue of the provisions signed and ratified by Greece."
