

Introduction

- 1. The Applicant is aTransportAssistant at the GS level in the United Nations Mission in Liberia (UNMIL). On 17 October 2014, he filed an Application contesting a decision dated 23 June 2014 to extend her Administrative Leave Without Pay (ALWOP) for an additional three and period on the basis of certain allegations that she had engaged in serious misconduct.
- 2. The Respondent filed Reply to the Application on 22 November 2014.
- 3. A case management discious took place on 11 March 2015 during which hearing dates were steatr August 2015 and the Tribunal set a deadline of 1 June 2015 for submission of witness lists and witness statements.
- 4. On 25 May 2015, the Parties filed a Motion praying the Tribunal to extend the deadline for submission of witness lists and exist satements to 15 June 2015 as the Arties have been involved in good faith discourse itowards informal settlement/esolution of the case and wish for an opportunity to conclude those discussions. Vide Order No. 182 (NBI/2015), the Tribunal granted the instance request.
- 5. On 2 June 2015, the Applicant prayed the Tribunal for leave to allow her to withdraw her Application pursuant to the terms and conditions of a settlement agreement entered into with the Respondent.

ORDER

6. The Tribunal herebyRECORDS the Applicant's motion for withdrawal and ORDERS that the matter of Coleman v The Secretary-General of the United Nations (UNDT/NBI/2014/097) be struck off the Court's docket.
