The World Meteorological Organization expects that 2019 will be in the five top warmest years on record, and that 2015-2019 will be the warmest of any equivalent five-year period on record.

Gimate-related risks to health, livelihoods, food security, water supply, human security, and economic growth are projected to increase with increased global warming.

Direct economic losses from disasters were estimated at almost \$3 trillion. Gimate related and geophysical disasters daimed an estimated 1.3 million lives between 1998 and 2017. An increase in heat stress could lead to global productivity losses equivalent to 80 million full-time jobs in the year 2030, according to the International Labour Organization (ILO).
