

## SUBSTANTIATION OF EXPENSES

<u>TITLE OF FUND:</u>	Secretary-General's Trust Fund for Development, Extra-Budgetary Trust Account
<u>IMPLEMENTED BY:</u>	Financial Sector Secretariat of the UN Development for Economic and Social Affairs
<u>OBJECTIVES:</u>	To support the follow-up process to the International Conference on Financing for Development (Mexico City, Mexico, 18-22 March 2002).

### ACTIVITIES PERIOD:

- (a) Contractual services to Friedrich Ebert Foundation to organize multi-stakeholder consultations to examine issues related to the mobilization of resources for financing development and poverty eradication, with a specific focus on "Financing access to basic utilities for all" (see TOR, paras. 102).

- (b) GTA-reimbursement of Income Taxes to one staff member, who was retained to organize two series of multi-stakeholder consultations on issues pertaining to (I) "Building an Inclusive Financial Sector" and (II) "Strengthening National Sustained Development" (see TOR, para. 102).

- (c) Contractual services to three expert groups: Salaries for three consultants (one expert on intergovernmental matters and two academic experts); (i) To provide substantive support during the 51st session of the General Assembly, 11-16 December 2005, to undertake academic research on "FDI in developing countries"; (ii) To write an academic paper for FFD's multi-stakeholder consultation on "Rethinking the role of National Development Banks" respectively (see TOR, para. 5); (iii) Travel of experts and consultants to multi-stakeholder consultations on "Rethinking the Role of National Development Banks" ("Promoting basic utilities for all" and "Strengthening the business sector and entrepreneurship in developing countries: the potential of diasporas") and related seminars and expert-group meetings (see TOR, para. 8).  
*Associated expenditure: \$144,000.00*

*Associated expenditure: \$33,838.74*
- (e) Travel of representatives to attend official meetings, Monitored sessions and conferences, particularly the annual Special High-level Meeting with Bretton Woods institutions, WTO and UNCTAD (see TOR, para 2 & 3).  
*Associated expenditure: \$2,500.00*
- (f) Hospitality money to organize a public reception during the second session of the Committee of Experts on International Cooperation in Tax Matters in Geneva (30 October - 1 November 2007) (see TOR, para 4). *Associated expenditure: \$2,000.00*
