Ambassador Cho Tae-yulserves as the Ambassador for Development Cooperation for the Republic of Korea. Previously, he served as Ambassador Extraordinary and Pleotientiary to the Kingdom of Spain, Deputy Minister for Trade in Ministrof Foreign Affairs and Trade, as well as Ambassador in the Korean Permanent Mission to the UN Office and other International Organizations Geneva, Switzerland. Prior to that, Ambassador Cho was appointed the Deputy Director-General for Trade Policy Planning, in the Multilated Trade Bureau of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MOFT) and the Special Commissioner in the Presidential Transition Committee of Korea.

Ambassador Eduardo Galvezis the Deputy Perament Representative of Chile to the United Nations. Mr. Gælæ also served alse Multilateral Affairs Director at the Ministry ofForeign Affairs of Chile. He was named Ambassador by President Rical agos and was Chief of Staff of the Minister of Foreign Affair and Director of Planning. He was posted in the embassies of Chile in the United Kingdom, France and the United States, as well as in the Chilean Missions to the United Nations and the Organization of Americal tates. Mr. Galvez received a law degree from the University of Chile and an M.S. in International

Relations from the London School Economics and Political Sciene. He is also a graduate of the Foreign Service Programe of both the University of Oxford and the Diplomatic Academy of Chile.

Mr. Olav Kjørven is the AssistatnSecretary-General and Director of Bureau for Development Policy althe United Nations Development Programme (UNDP). From 2006 2007, Mr. Kjørven led UNDP's Environment and Energy Grouppromoting sound environmental management and access to energy for poverty reduction and tapping into new financial mechanisms for development such as carbon finance. Prior to joining UNDP, from 2001 to 2005, he served the Government of Norway as State Secretary for International Development. He also held the post of Political Adviser to the Mister of International Development

and Human Rights (1997-2000). Mr. Artiven has also worked as the Director of International Development at ECON—Centre for Econom Analysis in Oslo (2000-2001) and an Environmental Specialist at the World Bank (291997). He holds an M.A. in International Affairs from George Washington University.

Mr. Roberto Bissio is the Head of the Secretaria Social Watch, a network of citizen groups in ove 0 countries that regularly monitor governments' compliance with the international social development commitments. He writes a weekly column on development issues for Latin American newspapers and a smember of Third World Network's international committee and of the victisociety advisory group to the UNDP Administrator.
