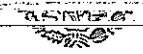

Distinguished President

At the outset allow me to express our gratitude for convening this Fifth High Level Dialogue on Financing for Development.

The agenda of Financing for Development is a milestone in the work of this Organization in support of the efforts of developing countries.

My delegation believes that each chapter of the Monterrey Consensus and the Doha Declaration are equally important and integral to the Organization's collective commitment to Development. The financing agenda demonstrates its value by allowing us to have a comprehensive and holistic vision of the challenges we face in mobilizing the resources needed to provide development in this sense, we are pleased that the agenda adopted during the current session, further the up of the Monterrey Consensus agreed during the current session, further the implementation of the Doha mandate.

Excellencies,

We firmly state the relevance for our High Level Dialogue of Financing of the preparatory process of the United Nations Conference on Financing for Development to be held in 2012.

Mexico believes that the agendas of financing for development and sustainable development are inseparable. We see in 2012 a valuable opportunity we shouldn't miss to provide a comprehensive vision of development, that includes the agendas: (1) on financing; (2) on sustainability; and (3) on implementation, including the Millennium Development Goals as part of the framework of development after 2015.

Therefore, we consider it necessary to convene an international organization of a follow-up Conference of Monterrey and Doha, which will take into account the results we expect from the Rio+20 Conference and will be a step towards the post 2015 Development Framework.

In the current fragile economic and financial context, the international community must act with an integrative vision of development to ensure the effective and transparent use of resources. In this connection, we acknowledge the consensus on the final declaration of the Fourth High-Level Forum on Aid Effectiveness, held recently in Busan, Republic of Korea.

Looking forward to the next three years, the main challenge Mexico faces, like other developing countries, is to promote changes that result in the promotion of production, diversification, innovation, competitiveness, preservation of ecosystems and sustainable low-carbon growth.
