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Aid for Trade

- x Australia supports the inclusion ofdafor trade issues in the elements paper and would like to see issuares und trade facilitation and aidfor-trade given a strong focus in the Addis outcome.
- x Research by the World Trade Organizatresearch shows that every dollar invested in aid-for-trade isptically associated with an increase of around \$8 in exports in developing countries
- x Australia has therefore made aid-toade a key priority of its aid program and has set a target of reasing aid for trade support to 20 per cent of our total devertment investments by 2020.
- At a bilateral level Australia workslosely with regional partners to improve critical transport infsaructure to facilitate traderansport infrastructure (PNG, \$400 million over 5 years).
- We also work with smaller partners including NGOs to assist smallholder producers and workerccess international markets (*Fairtrade Australia New Zealand, \$4.5 million over four years from* October 2014).
- At the multilateral level, Australia' Global Trade Integration Facility (\$60 million over 4 years) was launched in July support projects on trade policy and regulatory reform. This includes the World Bank's Trade Facilitation Support Program, hich will help developing

countries make their customs dother border processes more efficient.

Trade Facilitation

- x Australia would also note its suppoor the implementation of the WTO Agreement on Trade Facilitatio(ATF), which could unlock an estimated increase in global GDPUS\$1 trillion per year and create 21 million jobs, 18 million of which would be in developing countries.
- x The practical steps set out inetATF reinforce a number of key issues which have been raised in these discussions, including making it easier for businesses from developing countries to trade, help land locked countries, improve governamed assist regionhiantegration, which Australia sees as fundamental.
