In Certral Asia, UNDRR has provided support to Kazalinstan, Kyrgyz Republic, Tajilaistan, Turkmenistanand Uzbekistanimoon luting agapanalysis of disaster loss data collection systems and establishing disaster data steering committees with the aim of establishing retional disaster loss databases in each country by the end of 2022. The Almaty Certre for Emergency Situations and Disaster Risk Reduction has been capacitated as trainers of Senthi Framework muritaring to ensure sustainability for support to countries of the subnegion Furthermore, the Kyrgyz Republic and Turkmenistan have developed national platforms for disaster risk reduction in order to strengthenrisk government with an all-of-government approach.

Similarly, in Asia, UNDRR provides policy and technical support to Bhutan, Lao PDR, Morgolia and Nepal. Each country has been supported to develop Disaster Risk Reduction Status Reports which provide a snepshot of the country's progress under the four priorities of the Serrhi Francework, along with key drallenges and recommendations for strengthening the disaster data collection and risk governme. Notable progress has been made in Lao PDR where the national disaster risk reduction strategy has been reviewed to ensure alignment with the Serrhi Francework and ensure of the receivable data a priority into the new National Socio France Development. Han as a priority. Lao PDR and Nepal have also been supported to improve collection, management, analysis, and reporting of disaster loss data.

In Africa, UNDRR is working with the African Union Commission and the International Governmental Authority on Development (IGAD) to support LLDCs to strengthenearly warring systems. For example, Ethiquia and Malavi have been supported to develop early warring systems by using the myDEWETRA open source platforms accompanied by training an interinstitutional anargements needed to enhance data sharing mechanisms and standard operating procedures. South Surlandars received training and saster loss data collection and has established a national

platformfordisaster risk reduction Furthermore, a series of policy reports from Niga; Malavi, and Uganda provide key messages and priority actions for erhanding policy coherence between disaster risk reduction and dimate charge adaptation in order to bridge institutional and policy
