Key Issues and Opportunities

The nature and scale of risk is changing. Integrating risk considerations into the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals and SAMOA Pathway in the COVID-19 era and beyond, including emerging lessons learned from the ongoing pandemic and associated crisis, is fundamental for a green, resilient, and equitable recovery from the crisis.

Comprehensive Risk Management (CRM) approaches that locate risk at the core of all development and humanitarian interventions and focus on nurturing a common understanding of risk is essential to achieve the 2030 Agenda.

National Disaster Risk Reduction Strategies should be established or revised, incorporating inter-related risks including climate change.

Quality and reliable data on systemic risk is necessary to inform policies and programs in all sectors and at all levels.
