PBF IMPACT

The Fund's supports the development and implementation of National Action Planson Security Council Resolutions 1325 and 2250. These investments put women and young people in the spotlight as critical peacebuilding actors in Chadian society. As an example 90 local leaders including 30 women sensitized communities on the content of these plans through 27 radio emissions and almost 3 700 young people participated in trainings on advocacy leadership and strategic communication. 3 legal offices fully recognized by judicial authorities were open and are now operational in N'Djamena Lac and Mondou to alert prevent and peacefully resolve inter-community conflicts. The Fund thanks to a Youth Promotion Initiative also the development of the supported intra- and inter-generational Confidence Charter currently operational in the department of Nya Pendé and Barh Sara south for the prevention and management of conflicts at community level. Furthermore the Fund supports the establishment of a national Observatory for the Promotion of Gender Equality and Equity in accordance with the requirements of the National Gender Policy adopted in 2017.

In the Lake and Hadjer Lamis Provinces an area particularly hit by the effects of climate change pressure on the natural resources and violent extremism the Fund supported the creation of mixed groups for dialogue and conflict prevention around natural resources management between authorities refugees IDPs returnees and host communities. It also contributes to greater freedom of movement of communities in secure areas and increased resilience through alternative livelihood support and support to reforestation. Successful negotiations between different village chiefs and the authorities led to an agreement on the management of fishing areas and regular exchanges on resource management between the communities. Moreover through a Gender Promotion Initiative a study was developed on Boko Haram modus operandi with particular attention to gender issues and recommendations for prevention of recruitment.

In the North and Centre of Chad the Fund aims to enable youth-government dialogue and promote sustainable economic opportunities while raising awareness of young women and men about the dangers of migration to the north including human trafficking forced labour and recruitment by armed groups. With the finalisation of the locality profiles important information was collected about the situation in 14 localities most affected by youth migration which will form the basis to revitalise the exchange between young people and the local authorities.

In the East of Chad Wadi Fira and Ennedi East Provinces at least 126 conflicts between herder and farmers and host communities IDPs and refugees around natural resources could be addressed by the mixed committee structures including through joint management of natural resources. Pastoral ponds and grazing areas in the different localities have reduced the movement of livestock across fields before harvest in search of water and grazing and mitigated conflict linked to this movement.

As part of the Chad-Central African Republic cross-border initiative that ended in 2020 the institutional dialogue between the two countries on transhumance has resumed in 2019 for the first time since 2012. In addition a detailed map of pastoral infrastructure and cross-border transhumance activities was finalized as an important step toward sconsultative mechanisms. As a result seven social contracts were developed at local level involving 132 farmers and herder to build and strengthen community-based management systems of agro-pastoral resources and transhumance movements. Based on the success along the Chad-Niger border the demarcation of 150 kilometers along three axes of transhumance is also expected to reduce conflicts in this restive region.

The Chad-Niger cross-border initiative on resilient pastoralism which ended in 2020 developed a mapping of pastoral resources typology of conflicts and actors engaged in preventing and managing conflicts for the Diffa-Kanem region. A social pact was signed by the community for the joint management of a pastoral water points which has reduced conflict over its use. As observed by the head of the pro.6 45al
