# THE PEACEBUILDING COMMISSION

- † The intergovernmental UN body that supports peacebuilding in countries emerging from conflict and aid from the General Assembly and the Security Council
- † Unique broad and diverse, its members come from the Security Council, the General Assembly, the Economic and Social Council and the Financial and Technical Cooperation Board. The European Union, the IMF, the Organisation of the Islamic Conference and the World Bank participate in all meetings
- † The linchpin of the UN's peacebuilding architecture

## Key features

- † Help identify clear peacebuilding priorities for the countries on its agenda: Burundi, the Central African Republic, Guinea-Bissau, Liberia and Sierra Leone
- † Encourage national ownership, partnership and moral accountability
- † Network closely with the UN system (UN Security Council, Economic and Social Council, etc.) and the African Union (AU), the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS), the Commonwealth, etc.

# THE PEACEBUILDING FUND

## The Peacebuilding Fund focuses on:

- Responding to immediate needs for peacekeeping, or supporting peace agreements or political dialogue
- Building long-term national capacities for pro-democracy, justice and peaceful resolution of conflict
- Stimulating economic development and general peace dividends
- Re-establishing essential administrative services

## Key features

- Relatively small, with focus on monitoring and evaluation
- Broad donor base: 48 donor countries
- Can fund critical early interventions through the Immediate Response Facility (decision within three weeks) as well as longer-term programmes through the Peacebuilding and Recovery Facility
- Direct link to senior UN leadership - both at headquarters and in the field
- Inclusive - national and international stakeholders in Project Steering Committee established in countries
- Broad participation of UN agencies in implementation process, drawing on their comparative advantages

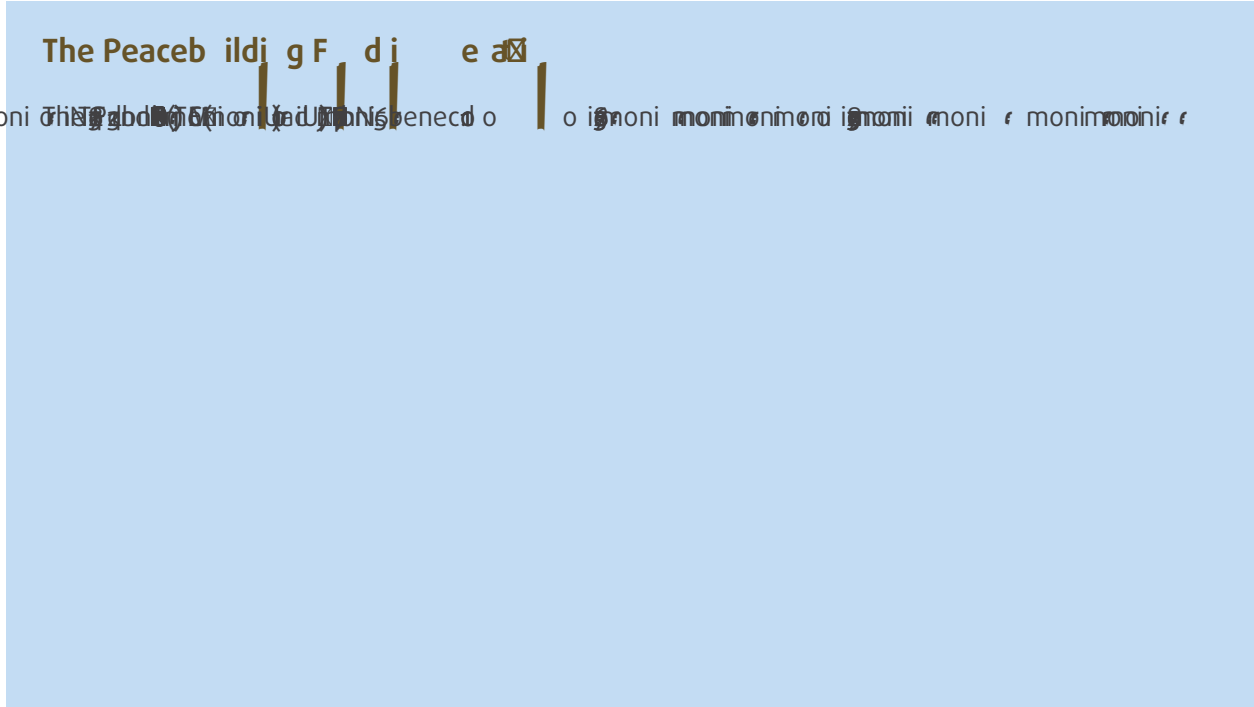
## Achievements of the Peacebuilding Fund, as of mid-2010

- Raised about \$360 million since launch in 2006
- Allocated \$180 million to 142 projects in 16 countries
- Appointed 6% of funding to projects aimed at gender equality

## Future Goals

- Invest \$100 million per year in peacebuilding
- Replenish fund by end 2011
- Strengthen monitoring and evaluation of performance and impact
- Increase proportion of funding for projects that benefit women
