Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to my letter dated 3 March 2021 regarding the General Assembly plenary meeting to commemorate the International Day of the Elimination of Racial Discrimination to be held on Friday, 19 March 2021, at 10 a.m., in the General Assembly Hall, in accordance with General Assembly resolution 75/237.

In this regard, and, without setting a precedent, I intend to invite Dr. Uzodinma Iweala, author, medical doctor, CEO of The Africa Center, and eminent person active in the struggle against racial discrimination to attend the meeting and address the Assembly on the occasion. The United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights, Ms. Michelle Bachelet Jeria will also address the commemorative meeting.

Herein, due to COVID-19 pandemic-related limitations in place on access to the United Nations premises, including quarantine requirements and without setting a precedent, I intend to present for the

on the 19th of March, a draft decision regarding the participation in formal plenary meetings of the General Assembly at the seventy-fifth session. The draft decision is proposed, without setting a precedent for future plenary meetings of the General Assembly, where quarantine requirements or travel restrictions are in place, to allow those who are invited by the General Assembly either to make a statement at a plenary meeting or to present a report, and are not a representative of a Member State or an observer delegation, to submit a pre-recorded statement, which will be played in the General Assembly Hall after the introduction by the President of the General Assembly at the plenary meetings concerned during the remaining part of the seventy-fifth session. The text of the draft decision is enclosed, and it will be issued as A/75/L.67.
