Panelists will also discuss how to reinvigorate HIV testing, achieving the 95–95–95 testing and treatment targets, as well as the 10-10-10 targets for equitable, inclusive and reliable access to affordable, high-quality medicines, health commodities and technologies. The discussion will focus on getting back on track to end AIDS as a public health threat by 2030, as a part of achieving the Sustainable Development Goals.
