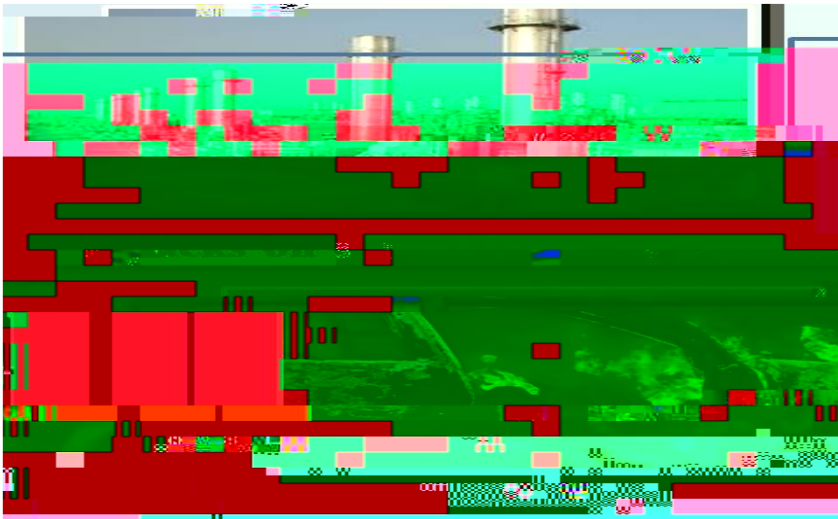


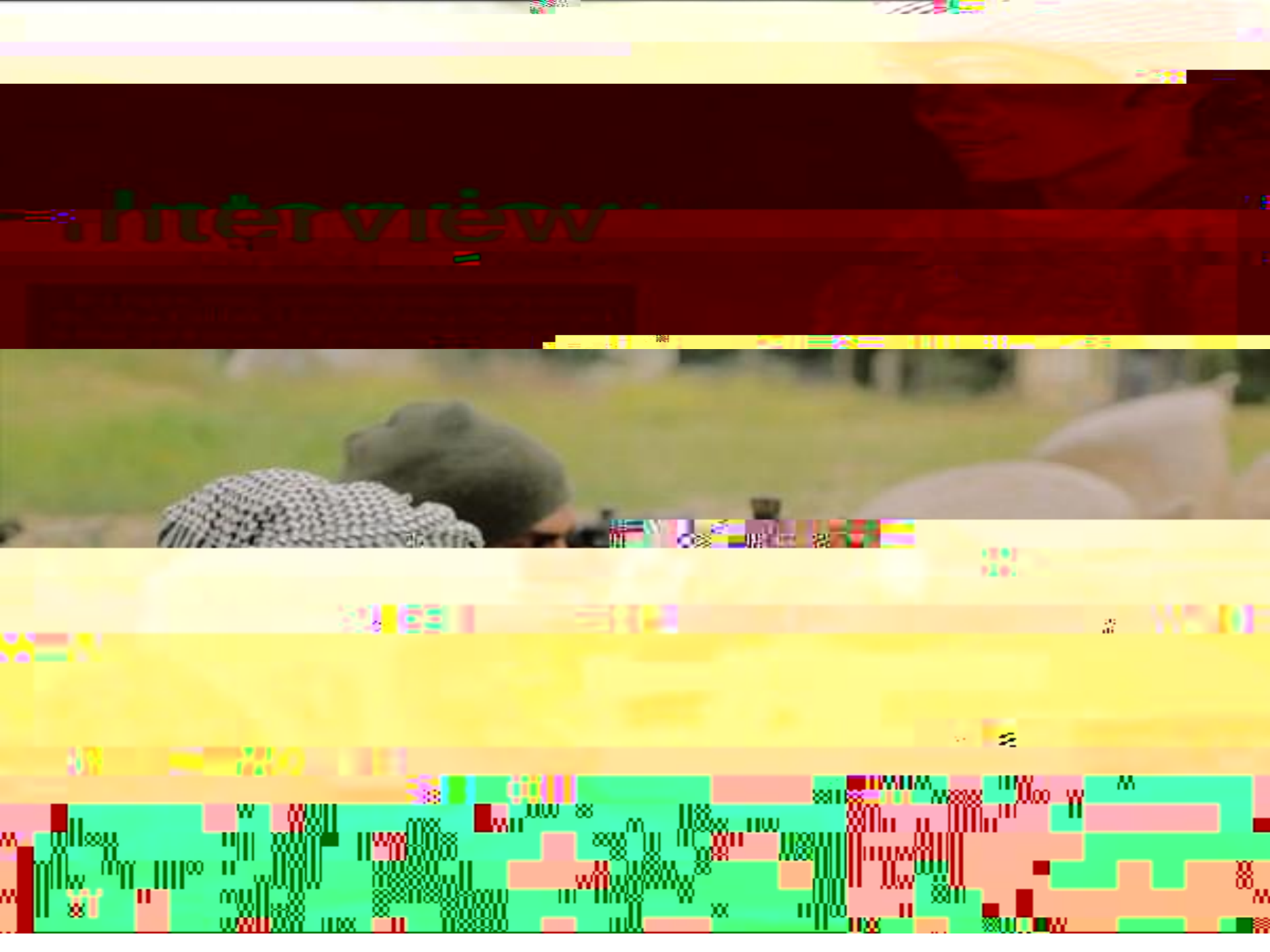


Immediate Significant Threats: high-probability, high-impact events

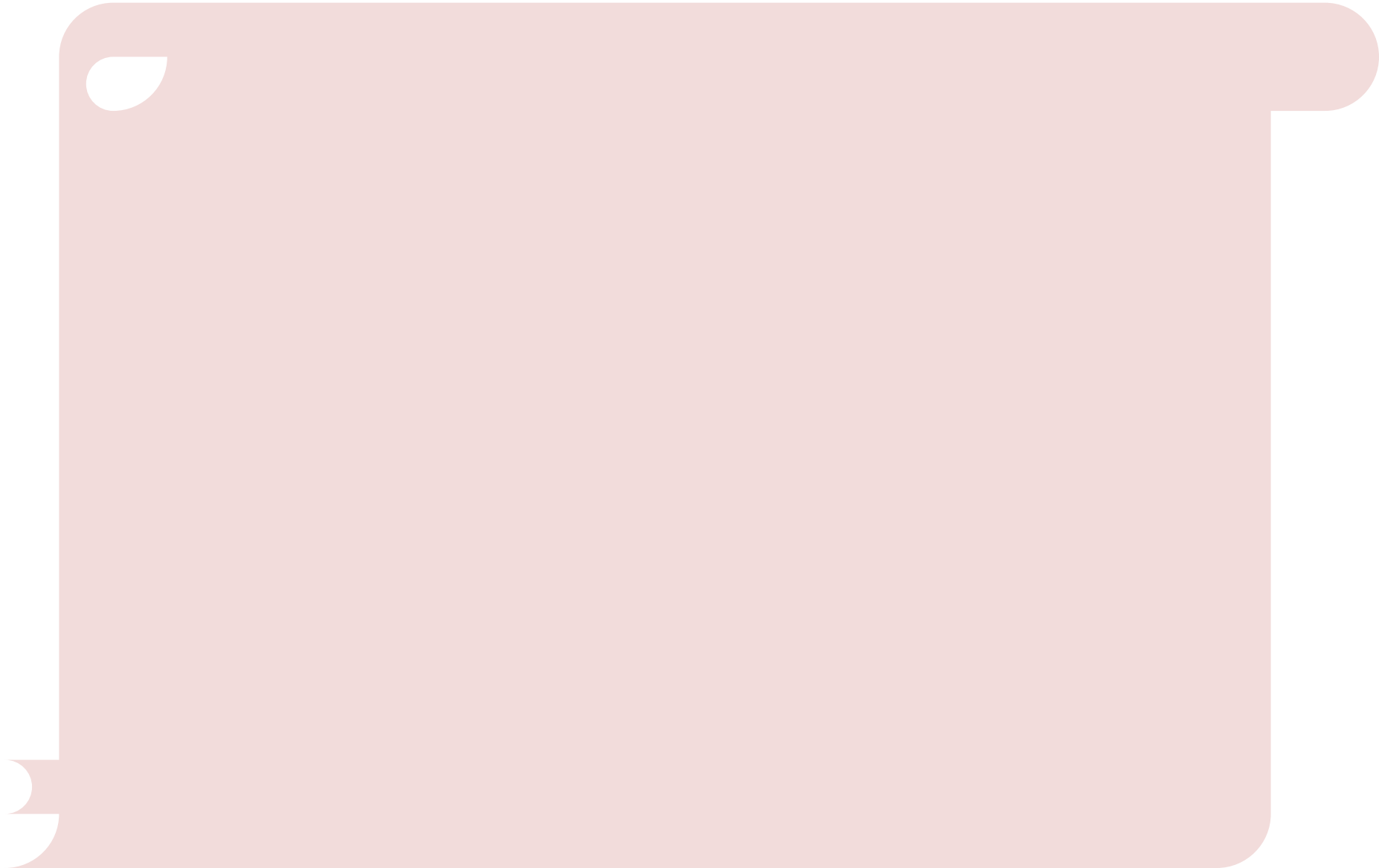


Substantial Threats: both likely and relatively high
