




South-East Asia

No operational mechanism for international joint investigations in the region

CTED proposal:

Strengthened international cooperation for the investigation and prosecution of terrorism



Challenges and possible solutions

Legal challenge

- not inter-jurisdictional investigations not allowed by law
- Coordinated or parallel joint investigations

Financial challenge

- Small states can't afford to Equal contribution of GDP to base

Administrative challenge

- Does the police have a jurisdictional authority

Political challenge

- What are the political interests of ASEAN?
