Another important focus of the OSCE is to support participating States with strengthening the **security of travel documents** and their issuance processes in line with international standards. The Travel Document Security (TDS) programme comprises four mutually reinforcing and complementary components: 1) identity management and security; 2) document security, including the use of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) Public Key Directory (PKD); 3) border control inspection, including through the use of Advance Passenger Information (API) and access to INTERPOL databases; and 4)
