During 20192020, the Swedish Migration Agency has also been a leading partner in a Twinning project with Serbiatogether with the Netherlands and Slovenia. In addition to developing legislation on asylum and legal migration, the twinning project will supprt Serbia in developing the possibilities of absorbing funds and developing cooperation with the EU. In the project, the Swedish Migration Agency has ntributed to Serbia harmonization process by evaluating and further adapting the current Serbians lating in to the applicable EU legislation in the areas sylum and migration.

Moreover, the Swedish Migration Agency has been a partner in the European Return and Reintegration Network (ERRIN), which is an initiative from Member States to facilitate test and reintegration by creating common, knowledgedriven and innovative solutions based on a European approach in line with GCM Objective 21. Some of the main activities of the program are to offer reintegration support for return through a network coallactors, offer solutions to facilitate the return of vulnerable groups, as well as to exchange information and develop tools to improve return talksthin the ERRIN program, the Swedish Migration Agency has also run its ownproject European Returnand Reintegration Network Sustainable Reintegration in Afghanistan (ERRINSRA) with the aim of increasing capacity and creating a permanent network of local organizations that provide reintegration services.
