
## **KIGALI DECLARATION**

Thirty-eight government and civil society women leaders of the Great Lakes Region (Burundi, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Rwanda, Uganda, and United Republic of Tanzania) met in Kigali, Rwanda for a training workshop on conflict management organised by the United Nations Division for the Advancement of Women, in collaboration with the Centre for Conflict Resolution of the University of Cape Town.

Recognising that women and girls bare a tremendous burden as victims of conflict and war, specifically as targets of sexual violence and abuse,

Recalling the Security Council resolution 1325 (2000) on women, peace and security and its call for the integration of gender perspectives in all phases of peace building, conflict resolution and



• to support women of Burundi and Democratic Republic of the Congo in the preparation of the International Conference on the Great Lakes region, which will not take place unless peace is established in the Great Lakes region.
