The 2010 CSW is a venue for celebrating key events and related achievements – including commemoration of Beijing plus 15. This panel is thus designed to bring together policy-makers, UN representatives, women's organizations and other development partners from countries that have developed National Action Plans (NAPs)/are in various stages of developing their Plans/and other allied mechanisms on SCR 1325, as well as on SCR 1820. It will explore what has been achieved so far in terms of development of women's empowerment capacities in conflict prevention, early recovery, relief and peace building processes under these actionable mandates. Discussions from this event will help to develop awareness and inform the "way forward" on this issue of concern in preparation for the SCR 1325 10" anniversary celebrations.

The focus will be on the following key areas:
