13. At the further confluence of the advancement of women and HIV/AIDS, awareness programmes on HIV/AIDS are being implemented in schools as well as in the National Service Programme. The Healthy Programme without AIDS for Youth (PROSTAR) is conducted to empower youths to become peer educators who disseminate HIV/AIDS information while promoting healthy lifestyle practices. The National Service Programme involving 21.4% of secondary school leavers nationwide annually (approximately 140,000 young people) represents a unique opportunity to

ensure that they are equipped with the necessary information, awareness and ability

to make informed decisions regarding HIV/AIDS.
