Also, to maximize the momentum of preventing and addressing gender-based violence, the National Commission on the Role of Filipino Women has helped organize a movement of men from various sectors, including leaders in their various fields and communities, aptly named "**MOVE**"

Despite these programs, challenges remain in containing the spread of the infection, especially the transmission to wives and children.
