



STATEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE GROUP OF 77 AND LDCs

THE GROUP OF 77, AT THE 55TH SESSION OF THE COMMISSION
ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN
(New York, February 22nd 2011)

Mr. Chairman,
Excellencies,
Distinguished Delegates,

1. I have the honour to speak on behalf of the Group of 77 and LDCs on behalf of the Group to extend our heartfelt congratulations to you and other members of the Bureau on your election to the fifty-fifth session of the Commission on the Status of Women. The Group of 77 and LDCs wishes to assure you of its full cooperation during the deliberations of this very important session.

2. This fifty-fifth session is a very special one, since it is the first one since the establishment of UN-Women. I would like to express our profound appreciation to you and other members of the Non-Aligned Movement in the role of Co-facilitator in the whole process that came out with the establishment of UN-Women. In particular, let me recall the comprehensive and forward-looking document containing concrete and effective recommendations that the JCC submitted to the Co-facilitator of the system-wide conference process. The Group of 77 and LDCs is confident that UN-Women will contribute successfully to a worldwide achievement of gender equality and women's empowerment.

3. In addition to that, sixteen years ago the United Nations convened the Fourth World Conference on Women, which was a landmark event in the history of equality, development and peace for women everywhere and in the interest of all humanity. Despite the progress made so far, challenges and obstacles remain in the implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action and the outcome of the twenty-third special session of the General Assembly Poverty still constitutes a major challenge for women, especially in developing countries. It continues to account for the majority of children out of school and women remain the majority of those who are classified as illiterate. Women's full and effective participation and equal contribution have not been overcome. Violence against women and girls persists in every country in the world. Women still suffer the consequences of conflicts. Women's economic empowerment is constrained by gender inequalities and disparities in economic power sharing. Access to labour markets and to

Women are still underrepresented at senior decision-making levels in all areas. The institutional mechanisms for gender equality and women's empowerment are still facing obstacles which impede full implementation of their mandates. Inequality, women's discrimination, and the enjoyment of their human rights. Stereotyped gender roles and gender inequality are still prevalent. Environmental degradation results in negative effects on the livelihoods of population at large and on women in particular. Girls remain particularly subject to different forms of violence.

4. Peace is inextricably linked to equality and development. Therefore, the international community should give priority attention to the plight of women living under foreign occupation and put an end to their suffering.

5. In light of the current global situation, the implementation of Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, new threats and challenges are emerging. In this context, the Group of 77 and China would like to stress the importance of addressing the impact of the global economic and financial world food crisis and continued technological, energy crisis and the challenges posed by climate change on women.

6. The Group of 77 and China stresses the importance of enhancing international cooperation and global partnership for achieving gender equality and empowerment of women, including the fulfillment of commitments on financial development assistance, debt relief, market access, financial and technical support and capacity building.

7. The Group of 77 and China reaffirms its commitment to the full and effective implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, and looks forward to a productive and successful session.
