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Mr. President,

Allow me to congratulate you and the members of the Bureau on your election. I wish you luck and success in leading the work of this important Committee.

Mr. President,

The State of Qatar has taken upon itself very seriously the promotion of human rights in whatever it achieves, particularly in the field of the Committee shows our permanent commitment to implementing the provisions of the International Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women and the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, particularly the principles of participation, equality, non-discrimination and non-harm. It is also committed to advancing the global policies on human rights of women and gender equality and the empowerment of women, and the outcome of the twenty-third special session of the General Assembly of the United Nations Development Goals.

The advancement of women and the exercise of their rights receives attention from the leadership of His Excellency Sheikh Hamad bin Khalifa Al Thani, the Emir of Qatar, and Her Highness Sheikha Moza Bint Nasser whose leadership has a great impact on the achievements related to the promotion of gender equality and advancement of women at all levels.

The State of Qatar is based on the respect for human rights and the elimination of discrimination in its institutions as well as the empowerment of women so they can play an active and essential role in society. The Qatari constitution did not allow women to study with men in education, as

The Comprehensive Qatari Vision for development (the Qatar National Vision 2030), adopted in accordance with the Emiri Decree No. (44) of 2008, stressed the importance of enhancing women's opportunities and enabling them to participate in all fields, especially those related to decision-making. Furthermore, the State of Qatar's Participation Policy aims to empower women and promote the values of justice and equity between genders. And the General Strategy for the Family seeks to empower women in the social, economic, educational and political fields.

Mr. President,

We would like to emphasize that the educational system in the State of Qatar has succeeded in raising the level of educational attainment and cognitive development of girls and women through numerous measures taken by the State to combat the phenomenon of illiteracy. These measures consist of the strict application of the law on compulsory primary education and adult literacy programs, which resulted in the decrease of illiteracy rate among Qatari women from 27.2% in 1990 to 5.4% in 2007 and to 1.5% in 2010. Also, the government is striving to encourage and organize scientific research through the allocation of 1.8% of government budget in the state budget for scientific research.

In this same vein, in April 2010, the Supreme Council of Information and Communication Technology (ICT QATAR) and Qatar Telecom Group have launched a pilot project aimed at women's work from home. This project aims to enable women to face the challenges of work and family in order to combine their family obligations and their professional participation in the labor force. The proportion of Qatari women's use of Internet has increased in 2010, reaching 60.2%, up from 28.0% in 2004.

Finally, the State of Qatar's efforts in the field of education and education through various initiatives prepared to increase its influence at the regional and international levels through the role played by Her Highness Sheikha Moza Bint Nasser in her different capacities, including in her capacity as the UNESCO Special Envoy for Basic and Higher Education. As such, she created the foundation "Education Above All" in 2009, which aims to assist in implementing the right to education in times of crisis and conflicts in Ismailia in Egypt and in Istanbul during the Alliance of Civilizations held in Madrid in 2008. Her Highness also launched the international initiative "Sheikha Moza" which focuses on youth employment.

Mr. President,

The persistence of conflicts in different parts of the world is a major obstacle to the elimination of violence and abuse suffered by women. From this podium, we reiterate our call to all countries to end violence against women.

save the Palestinian women and their families who live in areas under foreign occupation or; also for urgent solutions to their tragic situation.

In conclusion, the State of Qatar will continue in its quest to fulfil the issue of promoting gender equality and the empowerment of women into a strategic objective in its efforts at the national and international levels.
